Inspired by South Africa

Turtle Wisdom

We have enough supplies to make 50 turtle bracelets. They are one of Inspired by South Africa's best sellers. We use turquoise from South Africa, silver spacers and a choice of clasps. The money earned from the purchase of the bracelets goes to the Bridgman Development Centre in Soweto, South Africa via Global Ministries.

<u>Tea Bag Pouches</u>

A snug little bag to be sewn with fabric and lining from South Africa. The button closure is also from South Africa. A tea bag from South Africa is inserted in the bag. Our tea bag pouch is very handy to carry with you when visiting a coffee drinking friend. We use a lovely basket from Ghana to hold an array of our tea pouches.

Elastic Bracelets

Because we have many beads in many colors, you can let your color sense run wild. The beads are strung on an elastic cord and tied to form a bracelet, the knot is secured by dotting it with colorless nail polish. The bracelets are easy to make and sold at a reasonable price. Remember they should be rolled on the wrist and not pulled and stretched.

Prayer Box Bracelets

A color is first chosen and beads are selected in different shapes and sizes and strung on an elastic cord. A magnetic prayer box in gold or silver is strung along with the beads. The box contains a prayer with the word for Peace in English and again in Zulu. The bracelets are beautiful as well as meaningful.

<u>Necklaces</u>

Our necklaces are divided into three categories - Sea Life - Safari- and Other. Sea Life has pendants of starfish, shells and other marine life. Safari has animal pendants as well as African symbols - Wisdom without Words. We use three different clasps on all our necklaces. Lobster claw, toggle and hook and eye. We make necklaces in both gold and silver.

Rainbow Collection

Since South Africa is known as the Rainbow Nation, in this collection we use a multi-colored bead to celebrate the diversity of South Africa. We feature necklace and earrings sets using pendants of butterflies, tree of life and humming birds. Included in the Rainbow Collection is a rather unique cross. The cross is Sterling Silver and is to be worn across your heart.

This is what we do, now can you tell us what you can do to help carry on this important mission. We need help beading, setting up and maintaining a calendar of events, investigating new venues, and sewing our new patchwork bags. Each bag tells our story. We hope they will be successful. When sorting through the beads, I am reminded of the women who are making their way from poverty and their children's smiling faces. Just the realization that you are touching so many lives can change your own life.

Please consider joining us on Saturdays during the month of January (weather permitting, of course) when we will be beading and sewing.
